It aims to imagine possible (real) sustainable models for computational infrastructures, as an alternative to the growing techno-solutionist trend. This publishing feed is produced as a hybrid publishing process and is realised by Manetta Berends and Alice Strete from Varia ([varia.zone](<https://varia.zone>)), a collective-space in Rotterdam working with/through/on everyday technologies.

The network nourishes her subscribers at irregular times and will provide means to her readers to further disseminate the material in different networked ways.
